



An Introduction to the RDPE Network June 2010

What is the RDPE?

The Rural Development Programme for England (RDPE) is a seven year funding programme, with a budget of £3.9 billion, which will bring into effect the rural development priorities or axes of the European Rural Development Regulation:

- Axis 1 Improving the competitiveness of the agriculture and forestry sectors;
- Axis 2 Improving the environment and the countryside
- Axis 3 Improving the quality of life in rural areas and encouraging diversification of the rural economy;
- Axis 4 Building local capacity for employment and diversification.

What is the RDPE Network?

The role of the RDPE Network is to support the delivery of the programme through:

- Providing tools and opportunities for those involved in RDPE to share their ideas, practice and experience;
- Operating across the four axes and link information at EU, UK, national, regional and local levels;
- Working with existing information exchange mechanisms and networks, to avoid duplication and maximise joint opportunities.

The Commission for Rural Communities has been tasked by Defra, to act as the Network Unit to co-ordinate the RDPE Network and UK National Rural Network, both requirements of the European Rural Development Regulation. The role of the Unit is to facilitate networking activities and co-ordinate services to stimulate the exchange of your ideas and experience. The Unit consists of 2.8 members of staff – Rebecca Frost (Manager), Sophie Fraenkel (Co-ordinator) and James Elliott (Information Officer).

The diagram overleaf illustrates the different ways that the Network may be of use to you, so that you can utilise other people's ideas and experience to make the most of the funding available for your business, community or rural area.

Who is the RDPE Network for?

All Network activities and services are open and accessible to anyone. Everybody involved with RDPE, whether in programme management or using the funding are encouraged to get involved and share their ideas, knowledge, experience and practice with others, to make the most of RDPE funding for rural areas.



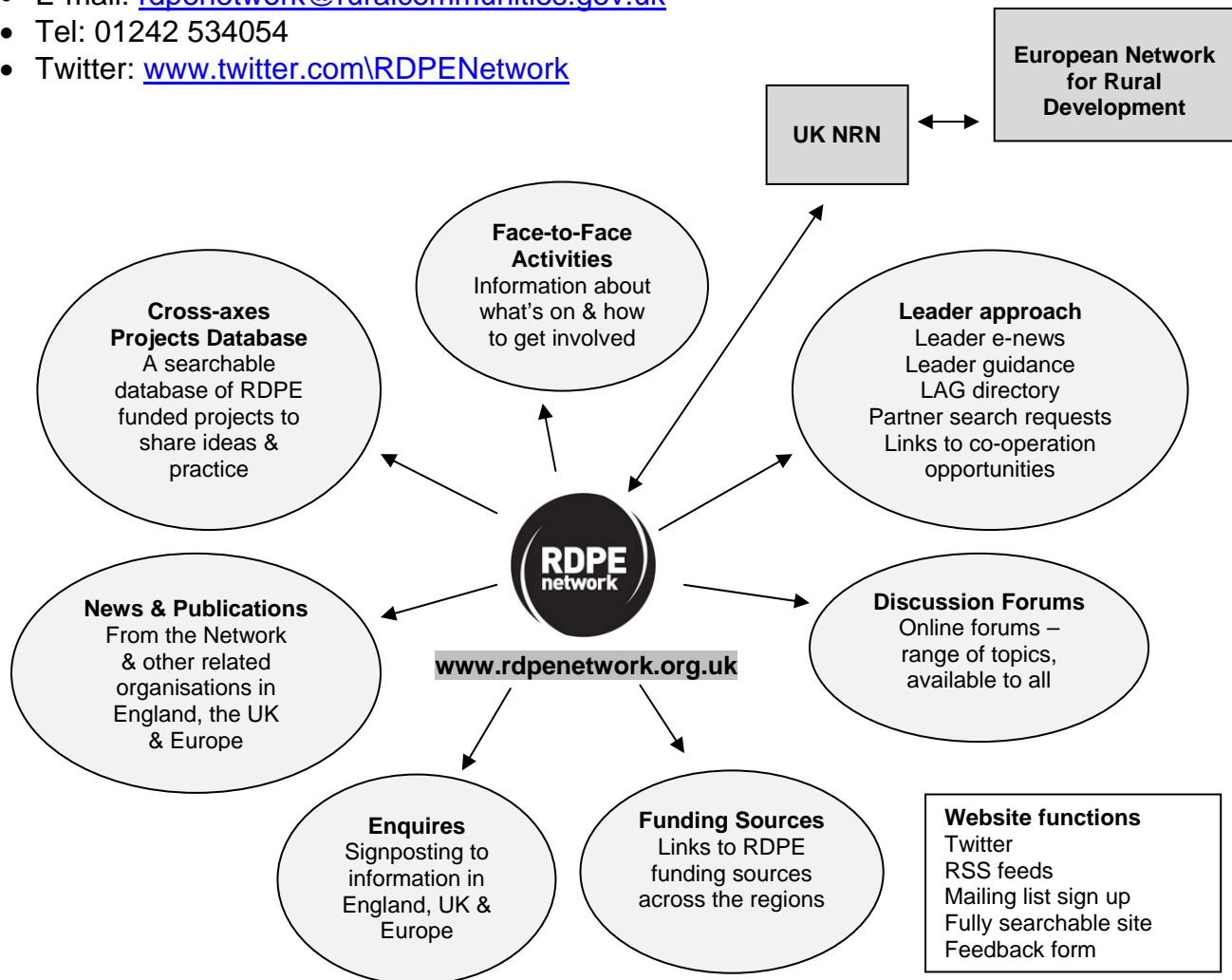
